IB readers can:

- Blend and segment onsets and rimes of single-syllable words
- Decode regularly spelled one-syllable words
- Recognize and read irregularly spelled words
- Read a IB text with sufficient accuracy and fluency
- Ask and answer questions about key details

While working in this level, IB readers learn to:

- Retell stories in correct sequence
- Demonstrate understanding of the central message
- Identify the main topic and key details
- Describe characters, settings, and major events
- Describe the connection between two individuals, events, ideas, or pieces of information
- Identify words and phrases in stories or poems that suggest feelings or appeal to the senses.
- Ask and answer questions to help determine the meaning of words and phrases
- Explain major differences between books that tell stories and books that give information
- Know and use various text features
- Identify who is telling the story at various points
- Distinguish between information provided by pictures or other illustrations and information provided by words.
- Use illustrations and details to describe characters, setting, and events
- Use the illustrations and details to describe key ideas
- Identify reasons an author gives to support points
- Compare and contrast the adventures and experiences of characters
- Identify basic similarities in and differences between two texts on the same topic.
- Look for familiar chunks inside unfamiliar words
- Decode words containing "r" controlled vowels
